

WAYNE MCGREGOR PreSentient MARION MOTIN NEW WORK HOFESH SHECHTER In Your Rooms

Rambert presents the first major UK revivals of two landmark dance works alongside a new creation by **Marion Motin**, whose hip hop-influenced style is probably best known through her work for **Christine and the Queens.**

In 2002, **Wayne McGregor** found the perfect match for his signature style of angular movement and lyrical phrasing in the music of **Steve Reich**'s Triple Quartet. The piece he made, *PreSentient*, marked the arrival of a major talent on the world stage. **Hofesh Shechter** had a similar impact in 2007 with *In Your Rooms*, a piece of heart-stopping intensity blending the personal and the political.

Rambert presents its new company with a programme of dance showcasing the most exhilarating and fierce choreography around today.

The triple bill includes a new creation by Rambert's Guest Artistic Director, **Benoit Swan Pouffer**, with original music by Brixton-born electronic and dancehall artist **GAIKA** and designs by London-based fashion duo **COTTWEILER**.

Rambert2 will also perform two works that launched the international careers of their choreographers: *E2 7SD* is a duet by Sydney Dance Company Artistic Director and former Rambert dancer **Rafael Bonachela** and *Killer Pig*, by Israeli dance star **Sharon Eyal**, is a group work showcasing her intense and distinctive movement style.

KIBWE TAVARES & SHARON EYAL Aisha and Abhaya

A world premiere co-produced with **The Royal Ballet**, in association with **BBC Films**. This new creation by director **Kibwe Tavares** brings together the work of choreographer **Sharon Eyal**, music by rising star **GAIKA** and costumes by visionary artist **Uldus Bakhtiozina**. Aisha and Abhaya (meaning "Hope and Fearlessness") is a contemporary fairy tale about two sisters seeking refuge from their homeland in a fantastical world, but one riven with familiar troubles and dangers. This world premiere combines film, animation and live performance by Rambert's extraordinary dancers to tell a compelling, immediate parable for our times. **Premiere: Linbury Theatre, Royal Opera House, 2019/20**

Rambert Event by Merce Cunningham

République Géniale, Kunstmuseum Bern, Switzerland

In keeping with Merce Cunningham's legendary Events, the Rambert Event features music and scenic elements that have been created separately and only brought together in the moment of performance. Set to a specially commissioned score by Philip Selway (Radiohead), Quinta and Adem Ilhan, the Rambert Event features extracts from pieces of Cunningham's choreography previously performed by Rambert, with set and costumes based on the Cage series of paintings by world-famous German artist Gerhard Richter.



Life is a Dream by Kim Brandstrup Touring the UK Sep 2018 - Mar 2019 Danish choreographer and two-time Olivier Award-winner Kim
Brandstrup's new work for Rambert premiered in May 2018 and tours the UK through to 2019. Illusion and reality collide in this retelling of the 17th century play by Pedro Calderón de la Barca, as legendary filmmakers the Quay Brothers place the action in a dream-like world. The rich, harmonious music of Witold Lutosławski adds to the otherworldly atmosphere in this tale of revenge and reconciliation.



Goat by Ben Duke Théâtre des Abbesses, Paris, France Apr 2019 Darkly funny and deeply moving, rising star **Ben Duke's** dance-theatre creation was nominated for a **2018 Olivier Award** for Best New Dance Production. *Goat* dissects the pleasure and pain of performing, inspired by the music and spirit of **Nina Simone** and with a selection of her best-loved songs performed live onstage.

Rambert in communities

Over 40,000 people of all ages and abilities take part in Rambert-led outreach and education programmes each year. Current areas of work include a UK-wide schools' workshop programme, events in theatres, large-scale participatory projects, an older adults programme, and annual holiday courses and evening classes, with over 1,000 workshops and events each year.

IN SCHOOLS

Rambert is core to the GCSE and AS/A Level dance syllabus, and the company works in partnership with schools and colleges throughout the UK to provide a range of workshops, teacher training courses and experience days designed to support the curriculum and inspire students and teachers.

Ohad Naharin's iconic immersive work will tour schools across the UK with workshops and Q&As delivered by Rambert2's dancers, breaking the barrier between the performers and their young audience.

IN OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

This autumn, Rambert's public class programme has expanded to include new early morning classes for adults and a greater range of children's classes, including hip hop and youth yoga. Rambert's classes are delivered in its state-of-the-art studios on London's South Bank, with a range of levels available, taught by top teachers from the dance community including dancers from the Rambert company.

As part of our partnership with social enterprise Coin Street Community Builders, a number of places in these classes are available to anyone living in the Coin Street neighbourhood area at a reduced rate, to provide affordable an affordable community dance programme in the local area.

FOR PROFESSIONALS

Rambert is committed to providing opportunities for artists to engage with the company and our work, as well as nurturing emerging dance-makers from both within the company and the wider dance sector. This autumn, Rambert launches new, daily professional dance classes, taught each week by a different leading artist from the international dance community. Teachers include **Chin Ying Chien** (Akram Khan), **Hannes Langolf** (DV8) and **Jason Kittleburger** (Eastman).

The Playground

After a successful first season in which over 250 artists from all backgrounds attended eight free sessions, The Playground continues in 2018/19 with its free monthly sessions for professional artists. Run by Rambert dancers Simone Damberg Würtz and Nancy Nerantzi, with Julia Gilespie, creative professionals from any background have an open

invitation to visit Rambert's studios, to explore, create, collaborate and play with other creative minds at no charge, with the aim to build a creative and playful environment.

Rambert2 brings together dancers with outstanding ability, creativity and individuality, to form a second Rambert ensemble.

It is the first junior ensemble attached to a UK repertory company, and the first programme in the world to integrate professional experience at the highest level with postgraduate study, with every dancer receiving a full bursary and financial support equivalent to the London Living Wage.


For the dancers, Rambert2 is an introduction to the top level of the dance profession, and a supported structure within which to develop their practice as creative, thinking dance artists.

Rambert2 will tour venues around the UK, performing work by top international choreographers Rafael Bonachela, Sharon Eyal, Benoit Swan Pouffer and Ohad Naharin. Dancers will complete a 15-month, full-time programme, of which 12-months are based at Rambert's studios and three months assigned to independent study and completion of a dissertation.

Following a national and international call for applications in November 2017, auditions to Rambert2 took place in February 2018. From over 800 applications, 13 dancers successfully completed five audition rounds; the final 13 come from six different countries in Asia, the Americas and Europe, with nine having trained in UK dance institutions.

Rambert2 extends the company's reach, taking distinctive, world-class dance to more people in more places. In addition to theatre performances, Rambert2 will also create and deliver unique education and learning experiences for schools and other communities.

Rambert2 is supported by The Linbury Trust and is a collaboration with Rambert School. The inaugural season is commissioned by Sadler's Wells, with additional support from artsdepot.
